

What led you to your current role in the Uniting Church?

I have a long history in children's ministry, beginning at the age of fifteen which ultimately led to becoming the Children and Families Pastor at Nedlands. I have been involved in the Uniting Generations Network since its inception because I believe it is very impLorem ipsum ortant that we help each other to grow in our ministry to young people. It became important as a Candidate that I experience the diversity of the Uniting Church. Being in this role enables me to use the skill sets I have to help congregations while I learn more about the Uniting Church here in WA. What is something you would like the church to know about ministry with children, youth and young adults?

Please, please, please talk to the children and young people we have. Ask them how they would like to serve, how do they learn best and what would help them to feel comfortable in inviting others to church. The Health Department said it best – Act Belong Commit. If we want younger generations to commit to Christ and the body of Christ (the church), they need to feel that they belong and have an active role in the church, which includes being heard.

Also, the harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. We need more people willing to be a part of children, youth and young adult ministry. Too often it gets left to a few in the church, which can lead to burnout of those volunteers, and our young people become connected to a few individuals not the church.

What Is Ash Wednesday? What Is Lent?

Ash Wednesday 5th March 2025 begins the Lenten season. Lent is the time before Easter when Christians prepare to commemorate Jesus's Resurrection through prayer, penance and fasting.

During Lent, there are many special days and phrases. These include Mardi Gras, Shrove Tuesday, Maundy Thursday, Holy Week, Palm Sunday, Passion Sunday, dust to dust, and more. If you're looking for answers about ashes on the forehead or Jesus Christ Pilgramage come to the **Lenten** Studies on a Thursday at 10am during LENT. These studies will be a time to connect with each other about our Christian journey and will allow us to get to know each other in more depth.

Some people don't give up things on Sundays during Lent, and that's okay because our sacrifices are voluntary. But fasting on Ash Wednesday and not eating meat on Fridays during Lent can be part of your journey.

What's the Deal with Ashes on Ash Wednesday?

On Ash Wednesday, wearing ashes on your forehead can feel like a bold proclamation of Faith, drawing curious or puzzled glances from others. Remember, this visible sign of repentance and humility is an opportunity to witness to Christ with quiet confidence and a joyful heart.

Purpose of Lenten Season

Lent is a time of spiritual preparation, self-examination, and penance leading up to the celebration of Easter Day. This can be a time to imitate Jesus' forty days of fasting in the desert. It is an opportunity for us to deepen our relationship with God, seek forgiveness for sins, and grow in spiritual discipline. Some Christians focus on self-denial, prayerful reflection, and charitable acts as a means of drawing closer to God.
